## **2016 National Standards and Ngā Whanaketanga Results**

### **Mathematics**

Mathematics results showed 83% achieved 'at' or 'above' the standard at the end of 2016, including 37% 'above.'

There were some particularly positive results for cohorts. The cohort of students who were assessed 'after 3 years' had 40% 'at' the standard and 60% 'above' the standard. In Year 7, 89% were assessed 'at' or 'above' the standard and in year 8, 87% were assessed 'at' or 'above'. This included 52% above.

When comparing 2015 and 2016 National Standard results the most significant gains were in mathematics.

Overall there were 19 children returning this year who did not meet the National Standard expectation.

While Māori student achievement is up from last year, there is still a significant number of Māori students over represented in those who did not meet the National Standard expectation.

Teachers know the learning needs of all the students who did not meet the National Standard expectation. They are addressing these needs through their mathematics programmes, with the aim of accelerating each child's achievement.
