Te Reo o Te Wiki Māori - Māori Language Week - Te Reo Māori Parade - This year we are again participating in the parade being held in Wellington to celebrate Te Reo Māori. This is an opportunity for all of us, regardless of our proficiency levels, to show our support for Māori language, our own Māori Immersion Strand and our aspirations for teaching and learning te reo Māori throughout the school.

The parade is an opportunity to celebrate our unique school and especially the kaiako, tamariki and whānau of the Immersion Strand classes. This is also an opportunity to practice our own reo. The Original and Montessori Strands have always incorporated some te reo Māori, however last year the school developed a specific te reo Māori Plan for English medium classes, which has been implemented this year.

If you wish to join us for the parade we will be gathering at the Cenotaph near Parliament at 10.50am and following the parade through town. We will have lunch at Te Papa and return to school at 1.30pm.

With 15 hand-made African drums, flutes and stunning costumes, WALA engage their audiences in a call and response song, invite them to try out different instruments and to join in the dance. Their enthusiasm is utterly contagious as they rejoice in the live sounds and rich heritage of their people. WALA means "life" in their local language and the perfection of the name becomes clear as they explode into their breathtaking celebration of the Ghanaian Spirit. Cost is \$4.50 per student.
