Yesterday Te Kura o Otari showed its support for "Kia ora te reo Māori" with the entire school participating in the parade in Wellington. We appreciated the support of whānau who joined us along the way. We have much to celebrate at Otari School. This year the Original and Montessori strands have been implementing our new *Te Reo Māori in the Original and Montessori Strands Curriculum Plan*. This school plan identifies the priorities for teaching te reo Māori in the English medium setting. It provides teachers with guidance on how to use our key Ministry of Education Resources. We use "Te Aho Arataki mō te Ako i Te Reo Māori-kura Auraki (Curriculum Guidelines for Teaching and Learning Te Reo Māori in English Medium Schools Years 1-13) and a supporting document "He Reo Tupu, He Reo Ora". Another cause for celebration is the verification of the Māori Immersion Level 1 status confirming that Te Maruatanga o Aotearoa is being delivered at a level that warrants the strand being termed as "Full Immersion."

We know we all need to have an ongoing commitment to furthering our reo and that we can all keep moving forward in our learning, regardless of our own proficiency. Yesterday was about acknowledging this commitment. At Otari School it was also about expressing our appreciation for our unique structure and the whanangatanga that was so visible yesterday as our diverse tamariki walked together and held up their hand made signs and banners. Ka mau te wehi!

Ngaio Teacher - The Board of Trustee's Appointment Committee met on Saturday to interview applicants for the Ngaio Class position being vacated by Seetha at the end of this year. After careful consideration of three quality applicants the committee unanimously agreed to offer the position to Sally Barraud.
