Code Club - We will be having a Code Club again this year for children in Years 4-8. Code Club is an Otari School after school activity for Year 4 to Year 8 students and we aim to cater for all skill levels. It is run out of the Kererū classroom from 3.10 - 4.10pm Monday afternoons. Code Club is run by volunteer teachers and parents so there is no cost but a koha to the school office is always appreciated as we use school space and equipment. Pedal Ready and Scooter Ready - In week 8 tamariki in Years 1-4 will be participating in the Scooter Ready programme and Years 5-8 in Grade One of the Pedal Ready program. All sessions will be held within school grounds. These programmes are funded by Greater Wellington Regional Council (GWRC) and Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency so there will be no cost to participate. As part of the Scooter Ready programme tamariki will learn traffic



awareness, footpath etiquette, looking for cars reversing out of driveways and what to do at pedestrian crossings and intersections. As part of the Pedal Ready programme tamariki learn about bike and helmet safety checks, including legal requirements, starting off and stopping with control, steering and manoeuvring safely to avoid objects, looking behind while pedalling in a straight line, signalling to stop and turn left or right and using the gears. Technology for Year 7 and 8. Students are taken by bus, leaving school at 8.40am, to the Technology Centre at Karori West School. Matua Clifford usually accompanies them and supervises them at morning tea. The first session begins on Thursday 8 February. Children take their morning tea with them, as they don't return to Otari until lunchtime. At technology, children learn skills through cooking, building and constructing with wood, creating sewn items and working with other materials, such as plastics and metal to create

practical and aesthetically pleasing objects. <u>If your child misses the bus, please take them to Karori West</u> yourself. The cost for each student for Technology for the year is \$80.00 payable to Otari School.

The costs for digital learning platforms and reporting resources are 50% of actual costs. These costs can be paid now or during the year via internet banking (060561 0017355 00) or via EFT-POS at the school office. If you do pay via internet banking please send Jillian an email itemising what you are paying for (office@otari.school.nz).

Further information about digital learning and reporting resources - All classes will be operating online platforms for informing parents and caregivers about the learning that is happening in the classroom. The Montessori Strand uses Educa and the rest of the school use Seesaw. To enhance mathematics learning, some classes are also using *Mathletics*. Reading Eggs/Reading Eggspress is an online learning programme some classes are using to supplement their reading programmes.

These digital platforms are above and beyond the paper based resources we have used (and will continue to use).

Parent Donation – A voluntary donation of \$250 per family is asked of families. This can be paid as a one-off lump sum payment or instalments during the year.

Classroom Consumables – As shown on the stationery list, students are required to pay \$10 to cover classroom consumables for the year. A donation of \$10 for photocopying/printing/photography would also be appreciated.



Term Dates – There are two Ministry provided Teacher Only days:

- Friday 31 May
- Friday 25 October

Activity Account – Parents are able to set up an 'Activity Account' to pay for trips or stationery during the year; no need to search the house for gold coins! We suggest starting with \$30. A spreadsheet is set up and when trips/shows come up, the amount is taken from the account. You will be sent a printout of what the money has been used on. If you wish to start one up, please deposit money into the school account (060561-0017355-00) with Activity Account as reference.





Extra Food - On occasion, we need to feed children who don't have lunch or breakfast. If you are able to, we would appreciate donations of muesli bars, raisins, nuts etc.

Taonga Horomata – Virtues: We begin the year with the virtue of Whakaute, Respect

Respect is an attitude of honouring ourselves and others as people of value. We care for each person's dignity. Everyone has the right to expect respect. We show respect in the courtesy of our words and in our tone of voice.



He tangata takahi manuhiri, he marae peuhu - when a guest is disrespected, the marae suffers.



Important Reminders:

Issues and Concerns – We appreciate parents coming and talking to us when they have a concern. It is best to go to the teacher first if your concern is related to the classroom. For other concerns it may be appropriate to talk to a strand leader (Deborah, Erana or Susan) or the Principal. We want to address an issue as quickly as possible rather than have you dwelling on a matter.

Emails and expectations - There are times when emails can be an appropriate and effective means of communication. However, the volume, timing and the tone of some emails can cause concern and stress for staff at times. Sometimes emails are sent to staff late in the evening, or at weekends. We cannot stop this from occurring but we can manage ourselves and our responses. To support the well-being of all staff we have a policy that no one is expected to respond to emails **after 5:30pm or during the weekend.** Therefore, while a teacher may *choose* to answer an email in the evening or at the weekend, please **do not expect it**. In terms of managing their own stress levels teachers have been advised to exercise self-discipline and avoid answering (or even looking at) their school emails after this time as well.

School begins at 8.55am and we finish at 2.55pm. It is most important that children are at school on time, ready to begin the day. However, if for any reason your child is late, please ensure they pop into the school office to advise of their attendance.

Hats are compulsory in terms one and four. If children do not have a hat they must stay in the shade. The hats must have a brim that covers ears and neck (please ensure it is named). Caps are not suitable. We have some lovely bright cheerful bucket hats to purchase from the school office for \$15.

Edge Noticeboard - Our main noticeboard for regular announcements is on our Edge Student Management Platform. Parents are invited to download the app to access this and other information (including attendance and invoices). Information on how to download the app is at the end of the newsletter.

Absent Children - If your child is going to be absent from school please either use the Edge app, send a text to 022-561-3368, ring 475-3018 or send an email to office@otari.school.nz before 8.55am stating why your child is away.

Driveway and Parking - Parents are asked to refrain from parking at the bottom of the driveway between 8.15 - 9.30am and 2.45 - 3.30pm. Parents are to 'drop and go' only. Please do not park up or down the drive and leave your car. The Otari Bush Reserve (around the corner) is available for temporary parking, or park on Wilton Road.

Please be considerate of the residents who live in Shropshire Avenue and don't park over their driveways and in particular please do not park blocking the footpath. Children use this footpath and on too many occasions have had to walk on the road to get past a car parked illegally.

Lost Property - Please make sure you name your child's clothing! This is very helpful if items are left around the school.

Permission for Trips/Shows – When you enrol your child in the school you are asked to sign a document giving blanket permission for your child to attend trips or shows. You will be advised of events your child is participating in.

School Closure - Should the school need to be closed due to unforeseen circumstances (e.g. bad weather) the following will occur:

- A closure notice will go on The Breeze and Newstalk ZB radio stations.
- A closure notice will go on our facebook page.
- A closure notice will go on the school web page. Make sure you use the refresh button to get up-to-date information.



Using Edge Caregiver Portal and Mobile App

Access to the edge caregiver portal and mobile app uses the existing email address that your school has on record.

The edge caregiver portal/app allows you to view school information about your child, view outstanding payments and input absences. The portal & app gives you quick and easy access to the information for the children in your care as well as being able to receive announcements and notifications from the school.



To login:

1. Enter the website https://parent.edgelearning.co.nz/ into your browser.

2. Either:

- a. click the icon (either g+ for Google, Facebook or Office 365), that is associated with the email you have supplied to your school. A popup will appear asking for your login details. On entering this correctly the Edge caregiver home page opens, **or**
- b. if your email is not associated with the three above (they are all free, easy to sign up to and don't necessitate you using that email for other purposes), type in the email address you supplied to the school. You will then be asked to supply a password. Choose the 'Forgot Password' link and you will be sent an email (to the address you logged in with). This will allow you to create/reset your own password.

Select your child from the top row. Summary data is displayed in separate tabs (dependent on whether they're attending a primary, area or secondary school using Edge) for:

- Attendance,
- Student Reports *
- School Payments **

- * Assessment data & Reports are available when published by the school.
- ** Dependent on you having Bill Payer status (and the school has setup online payments), the 'School Payments' page shows a balance and list of items owing for which the student has been billed. You may be able to pay from the 'School Payments' page (not currently supported at Otari). This page displays financial transactions for your student, with the balance due reflecting the amount totalled for your students at this school.

All other information including attendance is live. Where relevant, information from previous years can also be accessed.

If you haven't given the school an email address or are unsure about the detail please contact the school office.

Edge Mobile App

This can be downloaded from either Play Store (Android) or App Store (iOS). Search for musac edge.

Once installed you will be asked to make up a 4 digit pin then enter your Edge email and password.


In the app there is a series of labelled tiles that when tapped bring up information on your child's contact details, timetable, attendance, NCEA results and related data. Your school may

> also push announcements and notifications to the app and optionally allow you to send 'Notify School of Absence' notifications to the school.


