"Keeping You in the Loop"

A weekly update of news, events and activities:

- Michelline, our Enviro School facilitator visited assembly yesterday and presented the school with a big sign proclaiming our Enviro-school status. The Enviro School team, led by Britta, also presented the areas they are currently focusing on throughout the school.
- Technology has started and the children are enjoying their classes. These are currently on a Thursday. Children need to be at school for the bus by 8:45am.
- All three strands participated in creating sand saucers and/or painting beautiful flower pictures for the Wadestown and Wilton Flower Show last week.
- Year 1 and 2 children from the three strands are going to swimming lessons every Friday this term.
- We have bought a drum set and Steve is going to start a school band. Currently this is for children who can play an instrument. They will be meeting with Steve for practice sessions in the hall, on Mondays.
- All the classes are practising for the athletic sports.
- Classes are enrolled for a free trial of an online maths programme called 'Maths Buddy'.
- We have an American Fulbright Distinguished Award in Teaching Recipient visiting our school. Her name is Angela Palmeiri and she has a particular interest in bi-lingual and Immersion teaching. We may have other Fullbright teachers visiting us as well.
- Clifford is taking a staff meeting on an Action Learning model that he has used successfully with children. This is part of our focus on Inquiry Learning this year.

- The Board will be receiving the 2015 National Standards Report and 2015 Ngā Whanaketanga Report at the end of this week.
- Students who want to stand for Student Council have given their names to Clifford. Student Council will be made up of 4 year 7 and 8 students from each strand. Two councilors are elected by peers and two are chosen by teachers. Seetha and Clifford lead this group.
- Student Librarians are currently in training.
- The Board will also be finalising the Charter and the Strategic Plan, which along with the National Standards and Ngā Whanaketanga Reports, are required to be sent to the Ministry of Education next week.
- We are looking forward to the school picnic at Scorching Bay next week! Don't forget appropriate clothing and footwear, hats, sunscreen, water, lunch and togs.

Bus Routes 640, 641, 642 (Johnsonville, Khandallah, Ngaio & Karori) - The Greater Wellington Regional Council (GWRC) are reviewing our school bus routes. The data they have gathered shows the routes to be poorly utilised and likely to be cancelled. During a meeting held last week with Tania Savage (Cardinal McKeefry Principal) and Kerry Merriman from the Council, Tania stressed that she believed the data they had was wrong and these routes were well used by local schools. We will be recording how many students we place on these buses each day. Please support our submission to keep these routes going by emailing your feedback to Tania at principal@cardinalmckeefry.school.nz and she will submit it on your behalf. Please also consider placing feedback if you believe you may use these services in the future.

School Picnic at Scorching Bay - Our picnic is on Wednesday 2 March, leaving school at 9.30am. All children are to travel to Scorching Bay by bus (sorry, no room for parents). We require lots of parent help so please email Jillian (office@otari.school.nz) if you can help. We will require parents to help teachers supervise activities ie:

- Swimming and playing in or near the water
- Exploring the rock pools
- Playing on the playground

It would be great to see as many parents as possible, even if you can only come for an hour or two.
