National Standards/Ngā Whanaketanga - Many in the education sector have enthusiastically greeted news that the National Standards and Ngā Whanaketanga are being "scrapped." The Education Acts related to National Standards/Ngā Whanaketanga are still current however, and schools are advised to report to parents and Boards as per normal until the changes are officially made. We will be reporting in relation to National Standards in the end of year reports and looking forward to the forthcoming changes. These are likely to come into effect early next year.

At Otari School we will always report in relation to the four levels of the New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa that children are expected to progress through during their time at primary school. The standards/whanaketanga were based on these levels, therefore we will also continue to utilise some of the resources and helpful tools that were developed, while welcoming the move away from the rigidity, prescriptive nature and over emphasis on potentially harmful, mandated achievement labels.

ERO - We were expecting to be visited by the Education Review Office this year. It is very unlikely this is going to happen now; therefore we will await notification of when they are going to visit in 2018.

Children Leaving - We appreciate parents letting us know if children are leaving the school at the end of the year. This is helpful information as we plan for 2018.

Disco – The disco was a great success. Many thanks to our student councillors and a group of helpers. Special thanks to Jo Fullelove for her outstanding organisational skills.

Helpers' Morning Tea – It's that time of year again for the staff to thank all the wonderful helpers we have. If you have helped out with coaching, transporting, reading to children, mentoring, mending resources, sorting and helping in the classroom or numerous other ways, we would love to see you on Thursday 16 November at 10.30am, in the hall.

Wellington City Mission 'Pack The Bus' will be visiting the school on Thurs 23 November, 10.30am. It would be great if every family could donate something – they are collecting non-perishable items including Christmas items.

2018 Information

I have been putting my mind to the task of establishing classes for next year. As I explain in more detail below, there have been some extra challenges to work through. I have consulted with teachers and the Board before making final decisions that are in the best interests of the entire school.

Roll Growth - The main priority when establishing classes is ensuring there is enough space provided for all students. Due to very large cohorts in the Original strand (for example, 18 year 6 students) strong in-zone roll growth and a surge in Māori Immersion enrolments this has proved challenging. It is a positive sign that we are maintaining solid rolls in the Montessori and Original Strands and very welcome news that an increase in New Entrant enrolments means the Immersion Strand is starting the year in a strong position from which to continue to grow.

High Year 6 – 8 Original Strand numbers – In the Original Strand the year 6 – 8 bulge and the amount of new enrolments means 4 classes are still warranted. This has posed a problem, because since the Māori Immersion Strand has grown this year the smaller Pounamu classroom currently occupied by the Māori Immersion Strand will not be adequate for either the Original or Māori Immersion Strand.

A Temporary Solution – As a consequence the library is going to be relocated to Pounamu, including the surrounding space (foyer and teacher's room). The current library space, Te Whare Maire will be used as a classroom for a year, for the Original Strand. The Māori Immersion Strand will return to the three full sized classrooms in their block.

Moving the library space has been a last resort. It is not something anyone wanted to happen. It will involve considerable preparation and functional changes as a result.

Roll predictions indicate that Pounamu will be able to be used by the Original Strand again in 2019 and the library will return to its current space. For a year Te Whare Maire will be given a temporary name chosen by the teacher and children within the class.

Tōtara and Kererū Renovations – Tōtara and Kererū classrooms are having significant renovations. The two classes, comprising years 5 to 8, will be taught in the school hall for the first term. They might also be using the hall in the second term if the project takes longer than planned.

Lots of Moving! - All of the changes I have informed you of will involve classes moving this term. Kererū and Tōtara need to move their furniture and equipment to the hall and to the big blue container. The library has to move to Pounamu, Pounamu to Kaikōmako, Kaikōmako to Kākano and Kākano to the library. We have a busy last couple of weeks of term to look forward to! Your understanding and support would be appreciated during this time. At various times classes will not be able to operate as they usually do. They might have more play times, participate in a variety of different activities, or be involved in helping with some shifting. If there are any parents who could also help then please let the class teacher know. We are still in the process of organising the classroom shifts; therefore more information will be forthcoming.
