Last week was a very long week. It was nice to be at home during the weekend, enjoying the sunny weather and time with my family, away from the intensity of the previous week.

Hall Update - The hall has been thoroughly cleaned and all damage itemised. Damaged items have been removed. Most of the good hall chairs are fine and these have been stored in the basement. Other property, such as our drum kit, electric keyboard, carpets and staging will need to be replaced. We are already in the process of replacing the damaged sunshade. The school will now be undertaking a project to fix the structural damage, including replacing all the roofing. This will be done through Ashby Property Services, who are also our project managers for the Tōtara and Kererū refurbishment next year.

Library - The library is about to be re-located, therefore, the library is closed and all books must now be returned to school. Please have a really good look for books around your home, as there are about 300 that are due back.

Improving our Waste Management - Next year the school is implementing a new waste management programme. Britta and Clifford are working with The Sustainability Trust and Enviroschools to help introduce this. It will ensure that as much of our waste as possible is recycled. This will involve classes committing to having bins for food scraps, paper and plastics and metal, as well as landfill. All of these will be collected from the school once a week.

Contributing to the Wider Community and World - Earlier in the year many children participated in the World Vision 40 hour famine. The school received a silver award for raising \$3037.60.

We have also received a "*Thank You"* from the Wellington Free Ambulance for raising \$94.20 during "Onsie Day."
