Nau mai, haere mai ki te Kura o Otari

Today I met with year 5 to 8 children to talk to them about the way some of them are behaving and speaking on the playground when they are involved in games and activities. I reiterated our expectations in relation to this. Swearing, verbal or physical abuse and bad tempered outbursts are not going to be tolerated. We talked about how we deal with losing a game, not agreeing with the rules or feeling annoyed or unhappy about the way a game is going. We discussed strategies to employ when these feelings occur. We also talked about how our commitment to each of our strand values and our school wide values means within our strands and as a whole school we should all be able to play together, solve issues together and do our best to get along. I want the children to think about how to

- help reduce conflict situations
- avoid being passive bystanders when intervention is needed
- manage their emotions when playing games
- use building up language (not put downs or swear words)

Teachers/kaiako will be reinforcing these messages with all children. I will also be having a few follow up sessions next term, focussing mainly on our senior boys with the view to unpacking some of this further and hopefully equipping them to have more successful interactions, enjoyable play and even better peer relationships.

Drains - Recently a number of parents commented to Jillian about the flooding that occurs when there is heavy rain. Unfortunately there is nothing we can do about this fooding without the school undertaking major work. The drains are not blocked, they are just too narrow for the amount of rain that sometimes occurs. The "flood" soon disappears when the rain ceases. On these days, walking to a classroom, using an alternative route and using the steps outside the Original strand would be best.
