The above results show us that 70% of our students can write a recount that contains the surface and deep features either at or above their year level expectation. Teaching the features of recount writing across the school and then marking children's recounts in relation to specific criteria is one of our strategies for lifting writing achievement.

While there is little movement school wide there have been some shifts up and down within cohorts:

- 2023 Y4 there were 6/14 students at or above, the same cohort a year later has 11/16 students at or above.
- 2023 Y5 there were 14/19 students at or above, the same cohort a year later has 11/16 students at or above.
- 2023 Y6 there were 13/19 students at or above, the same cohort a year later has 12/16 students at or above (with 5 more above)
- 2023 there were 7/11 students at or above, the same cohort a year later has 5/7 students at or above.

Obviously there are influences such as students leaving a cohort or new students arriving.

These results feed into a teacher's Overall Teacher Judgement of where a child is in relation to the curriculum. Therefore a recount writing assessment is not an OTJ, which is based on multiple assessments, including classroom work and overall tracking of each student in relation to specific, schoolwide writing criteria. All strands have student writing profiles they complete each year.

The above results show that 72% of ākonga can write a Tuhituhi Taki (recount) that contains the surface and deep features either at or above their year level expectation.

There is very little change in the *at or above* percentage (2% = 1-2 children). There is a shift downwards in ākonga achieving above. This mostly concerns years 4, 5 and 6 2024 cohorts. These are all students who have had a change in teacher, currently in, or from, $T\bar{u}\bar{\iota}$ class. The assessment criteria is more deeply understood this year and more accurate, which may be reflected in these results.

I am pleased with the high level of moderation kaiako engaged in before finalising results. The aim is still to raise this achievement, however this is a long term goal.

Senior Cohorts

There has been a positive shift in the year 7 cohort of 10 students, 4 of whom were below last year. This year, 9 are at expectation and 1 child is above expectation. There has also been a shift upwards for one of the year 8 students as well.
