Road Patrol - We do appreciate the way most people support our road patrol students. With this in mind, it is timely and helpful to remind everyone of the requirements our patrollers must adhere to.



When the road is clear or cars are a safe distance away, the caller, on the school side, will

call out "signs out" and put their arm out indicating that no one can cross yet. Signs will go out, then the child on the other side, also with their arm out, will check the traffic and call out "Clear" when it is safe to cross. Then the caller will say "Cross now" and put their arm down. It is not until the caller says "Cross now" that people cross.

There are a few people who do not understand this and sometimes walk out onto the crossing and even around the child who has their arm out. Sometimes this includes adults who are obviously in a rush, however, they need to be mindful of the training that has gone into this role and the responsibility our road patrol students have. Some are new to the role and we appreciate your patience and support.

It is a busy time at the top of the drive in the morning and afternoons, with cars pulling into the driveway and driving out, buses pulling in and parents arriving to pick up children. It can get quite congested in front of the gate so please be mindful of all the traffic, vehicle and human, as the duty teacher tries to keep an eye on the patrollers and the children crossing the drive.


