Places in MONTESSORI and ORIGINAL Strands - New Entrants/ Years 1

Places in MĀORI IMMERSION – New Entrants/Year 1

Ōtari School Board of Trustees is limited in the number of places it is able to offer students as a consequence of operating an enrolment scheme, details of which are available at the school office.

The Board has determined that there are limited spaces available as follows:

For the English Medium Strands, (Original and Montessori) out of zone students who turn 5
between 1 July 2024 - 1 July 2025.

 For the special programme (Māori Immersion) out of zone students who turn 5 between 1 June 2024 - 1 June 2025.

If the number of applicants exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot, following the Ministry of Education defined priority order:

- 1. Siblings of current students
- 2. Siblings of former students
- 3. Children of former students
- 4. Children of board or staff
- 5. All other applicants

The deadline for receipt of applications is **Friday 17 May.** Applicants will be notified of the outcome of applications by **Thursday 23 May.**

If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held on **Monday 20 May**. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three working days of it being held.

Professional Development - On Friday, I joined teachers for a PLD workshop at school. Charlotte Wilkinson, teacher, education consultant and author of Maths Aotearoa delivered valuable professional development, furthering our proficiency for teaching mathematics and providing better understanding of the refreshed mathematics curriculum.

Reminder about school hours - Supervision is provided for children from 8:30am until 3pm. All children are to go home after 3pm unless they are being supervised by an adult. Children who need to wait for a few minutes to be collected are to wait outside the office area (where the red bench is.)



Performance – Next Friday (10th), all <u>Year 1-6</u> students will be attending the performance 'Wild Feelings'. This show has been named the **winner** of the Playmarket NZ **'Plays for the Young'**. The cost is **\$5.00 per child**.

'Wild Feelings' combines the curriculum areas of Science and Hauora through the characters of a jealous tūī bird and a famous bar-tailed godwit (kūaka). We dive deep into difficult emotions with the jealous tūī and surface with multiple ways to process and resolve uncomfortable feelings. We journey across the world with the kūaka and learn about her adventures and environmental challenges. 'Wild Feelings' examines the life cycles of the tūī and the kūaka, their interaction with other creatures

including predators, the threats to their habitats, and the impacts that humans have on these creatures.
