EOTC Week Years 1-6 — Whilst the Year 7/8 students are away at camp, the rest of the school will be involved in a week of activities starting with a picnic at Wainuiomata Pool on **Tuesday 2 March.** This is an opportunity for strands to get together and enjoy a relaxing day with the children celebrating our whanaungatanga and the start of the new school year. Parent help with some

supervision is appreciated. We will leave school at 9.15am and return by 2.45pm. All whānau are encouraged to come and enjoy the day. All children are to travel by bus; there will be room for about 20 parents on the bus; first in gets the seat.

The picnic is the first event planned for EOTC week. There will be other activities during the week including a trip to Wellington Zoo and a sleepover at the Zoo for Yr 5/6 students. We will bundle the costs together and let you know next week what this will be for the entire week.

Code Club - We will be having a Code Club again this year for children in Years 4-8. This is likely to begin in week 3 or 4 and will be on a Monday afternoon. We aim to cater for all skill levels. Technology for Year 7 and 8s is on Fridays and begins in week 2. Students are taken by bus, leaving school at **8.40am**, to the Technology Centre at Karori West School. Clifford will be the teacher accompanying them. Children take their morning tea with them, as they don't return to Otari until lunchtime. At technology children learn skills through cooking, building and constructing with wood, creating sewed items and working with other materials, such as plastics, metal to create practical and aesthetically pleasing objects. If your child misses the bus, please take them to Karori West yourself. The cost for each student for Technology for the year is \$50.00 payable to Otari School.

The costs for digital learning platforms and reporting resources and the Jellybeans Music are 50% of actual costs. For example the school is also paying \$14 per child for Jellybeans Music as the actual cost is \$28 per child for the term.

Further information about digital learning and reporting resources and Jellybeans music - This year all classes will be operating online platforms for informing parents and caregivers about the learning that is happening in the classroom. The Montessori Strand uses Educa and the rest of the school use Seesaw. To enhance mathematics learning, classes are also using either *Mathletics* or *Mathsbuddy*. Reading Eggs/Reading Eggspress is an online learning programme some classes are using to supplement their reading programmes.

In term 2 the whole school will enjoy 10 weeks of music lessons delivered through Jellybeans Music. Trained music tutors will be providing experiences in music once a week for every class for 10 weeks. Costs are charged to the school per child, however not all children are doing all things.

These digital platforms and programmes are above and beyond the paper based resources we have used (and will continue to use) and the music programme is an opportunity to provide music learning and experiences at a level we would not be able to provide ourselves.

Parent Donation – A voluntary donation of \$250 per family is asked of families. This can be paid as a one-off lump sum payment or instalments during the year.

Classroom Consumables – As shown on the stationery list, students are required to pay \$10 to cover classroom consumables for the year. A donation of \$10 for photocopying/printing/photography would also be appreciated.



Term Dates – We are having 3 Staff Only days; Thursday 1 April (before Easter), Friday 4 June (before Queens birthday weekend) and Friday 22 October (before Labour Weekend). School will not be open for students on these three days.

Here are a few reminders, especially for our new parents:

Issues and Concerns – We appreciate parents coming and talking to us when they have a concern. It is best to go to the teacher first if your concern is related to the classroom.

For other concerns it may be appropriate to talk to a strand leader (Deborah, Api or Susan) or the Principal. We want to address an issue as quickly as possible rather than have you dwelling on a matter.

Firing off an email when you are annoyed or upset is never a good idea, however there are times when emails can be an appropriate means of communicating and can be quickly addressed. Please be aware that staff may not read emails during the teaching hours. If something is urgent, please phone the school office.

School begins at 8.55am. We finish at 2.55pm. If your child is late, please ensure they pop into the school office to advise of their attendance.

Hats are compulsory in terms one and four. If children do not have a hat they must stay in the shade. The hats must have a brim that covers ears and neck. Caps are not suitable. We have some lovely bright cheerful hats to sell from the school office for \$12.

Please do not park up or down the drive and leave your car. The Otari Bush Reserve (around the corner) is available for temporary parking, or park on Wilton Road. Please be considerate of the residents who live in Shropshire Avenue and not park over their driveways.

Cookies are sold from the office at morning tea for \$1.30.

Lost Property - Please make sure you name your child's clothing! This is very helpful if items are left around the school.

Permission for Trips/Shows – When you enrol your child in the school you are asked to sign a document giving blanket permission for your child to attend trips or shows. You will be advised of events your child is participating.
