Annual Plan Goals - See below a condensed version of the 2021 Otari School Annual Plan Goals. A full version will be put on our website in the next few days.

- 1. Lift the achievement of groups of students in maths/pāngarau, reading/pānui, writing/tuhituhi.
- 2. Provide more experiences in music and the performing arts.
- 3. Successfully implement the two MOE funded 'Creatives in Schools' programmes (Māori Immersion/Ngaio, Kererū and Tōtara).
- 4. Further develop inter-strand relationships through shared experiences.
- 5. Pursue the development of a parents group who will support events and fundraising.
- 6. Establish a "Cycle of Professional Growth" to replace the deleted appraisal system.
- 7. Create more space in the library.
- 8. Prioritise the spending of the Ministry 5 Year Property Grant.
- 9. Explore ways Otari School can address climate change and reduce carbon emissions and establish a plan.

Year 7 Vision Screening – Information for Parents

Regional Public Health provides a vision screening programme for all Year 7 students.

- Vision Pupils will be advised of results at the time of screening. If further assessment is recommended you will be notified by mail.
- Children who wear glasses and/or are under professional care and have regular checks will not require a vision check from our service.

Non-consent – Please notify your school if you do not want your children being screened.

This screening is not a full assessment of your child's vision. If you have any concerns, please see an optometrist.



COMMUNITYDrama Club runs small drama classes, grouped by your child's age. We support your child so they feel happy and confident when performing in front of others.

We focus on developing your child's performance skills so they can give an engaging and captivating performance. Our drama classes work alongside the Trinity College London syllabus. Regional Public Health - WellKiwis Household: We are looking for whanau living in the Wellington region (Excluding Kapiti/Wairarapa), who have someone 19 years of age or under living in their home and plan to continue living in the Wellington region over the next two years to join an influenza study. The study is planned to run for seven years (although families can drop out at any time without any questions asked)

The purpose of the study is to investigate influenza transmission within the household setting and find out what factors make occupants more at risk or conversely what prevents some individuals from developing the flu.


There are many benefits of being part of an International study:

- During the Flu season whanau will have access to our clinical team (including Registered nurses, a midwife and phlebotomists),
- when unwell we are able to visit and complete a swab and inform the family of the virus causing their illness (including ways of keeping well/managing the virus)
- For every sample taken a \$30 e-gift card is given, these can be saved up and spent whenever the family decide to do so
- Families are contributing to the scientific knowledge about the flu and covid viruses

WellKiwis Infant study:

We are also looking for pregnant women living in the Wellington region who may be interested in joining the study. This study is interested in looking at how an infant's immunity is developed from their first experience of the flu and how this imprints on their immune system. The benefits are the same as above, and the study is also an observational longitudinal study running for seven years.
