Extra to the Curriculum

About Our Kura – Explaining various features of our daily school life.

Even though we are a smaller school with limited space, we provide a variety of opportunities for children to enjoy learning experiences throughout the year that are extra to the classroom curriculum. Some of

these activities occur because the school is willing to provide the space and parents pay for their child to participate. Activities parents pay for are guitar, (Thursday and Friday afternoons), keyboard (Monday morning), drama (Monday lunchtime and before school Tuesday) and Kelly Sports (Wednesday lunchtimes). Shani Leda teaches recorder on Mondays and Tuesdays at lunchtime. On Fridays, Ukelele is being taught by one of our parents, Esther King. Code Club happens on Monday after school in Kererū class. ArtSplash Choir is going ahead this year and interested children will soon be asked to sign up for this.

Year 6 to 8 children can become student librarians and year 7 and 8 children can join the senior Student Committee. This is a student voice for ideas and change and the children also get involved in fundraising and school events. "Bush Guides" is another opportunity for children to learn more about the local Otari Wilton bush. This usually involves students in the senior school. Otari Wilton Bush has funded this programme for the past three years, however unfortunately they are no longer doing so. We are looking at ways we can continue this programme using our own staffing. It has been part of Otari School for over 20 years.
