- **New Teaching Students:** Johanne and Deborah introduced two new students teachers who are with us for a month, Jess Shepherd in Tōtara class and Rosa Conway in Pōhutukawa.
- Student Committee message: Bake Sale on this Friday. Each strand's committee members will be organising a bake sale each term to help raise funds for step seating in the library. This Friday the bake sale is hosted by Kaikōmako students. Classes will be called over between morning tea and lunch to buy two food items. 40 Hour Famine 2021 - Yesterday Leilani from World Vision came to our hui to talk about the 40 Hour Famine. This is an annual event where students give up something (such as screens, chocolate, furniture or even speaking) for 40 hours or less over the weekend of 25-27 June to fundraise for World Vision. This year the focus area of need is sub-Saharan Africa.

In previous years we have been very involved with the 40 hour famine and we would like to get back into it this year. This is especially recommended for our older students but we do also have a supply of fundraising booklets available to be collected from the school office as an alternative to fundraising online.
