Staying Safe Online at School - We are in the process of upgrading the way we keep our tamariki safe online by switching to the N4L reporting app. This tool allows us to see online browsing data over our school's Wi-Fi network, including attempts to access websites currently blocked by the school. We are not able to monitor access to websites by personal cellphones, however we do restrict access to cellphones. Each class has rules pertaining to the use of these. Children are not allowed to use cellphones without permission. There are three people with access to this data: Clifford, Jillian and Deanne (IT co-ordinator).
