Relievers - Like many schools, we are having considerable difficulty securing relievers at the moment, especially when a teacher rings in unwell. We are having to quickly make decisions utilising staff that are actually employed to support certain children or run special programmes. I will also go into a classroom should that be needed and have done so on occasion.





Sports Events Supervision - When there are sports events, the lack of relievers and availability of parents adds to the pressure we are under to ensure there are enough teachers to attend these events and to cater for the children at school. This is why parent help at these events is essential. This week we may need to send two teachers to the

Western Zone netball when we should only need to send one. In future, if the combination of a lack of relievers and a lack of available parents continues I may need to cancel our attendance at a sports event to ensure classes can continue as planned at school.

Getting ready for 2022 - We are beginning to think about next year and how classes will be structured. If you know that your child/children won't be returning next year it is helpful to let us know this. Also, if you have children who will be coming next year that we have not already recorded on our future enrolment lists, then please let Jillian know.
