**Education Vaccination Mandate** -The Government has announced nationwide mandatory vaccination for the education workforce in order to work onsite. In accordance with the recently released Public Health Orders related to testing and vaccination, all those covered by the mandate are required to have received the first COVID-19 vaccination by 15 November 2021 and to be fully vaccinated by 1 January 2022. They must provide evidence of their initial

vaccination by 15 November. If a person under this mandate does not provide the school with this evidence then it is assumed they have not been vaccinated and will be in breach of the order if they attend work onsite when students may be present.

The following people are covered by this mandate:

- Teachers
  Teacher aides
- Sports coaches Providers of tuition (sports, music, drama, academic)
- Volunteers Contractors
- Anyone engaged to provide onsite services

If this mandate covers you then please provide proof of vaccination to the school office by 15

November. Proof can be obtained from the Ministry of Health. Some people have had to create a My Health Account and then needed to screenshot the vaccination record in order for their name to be included.
