School Covid Update: Since this morning's announcement we now have 14 confirmed cases - 11 children and 3 staff members. Children are from:

1 staff member is connected to Tūi, 1 to Tōtara, Kererū and Kākano and 1 non-teaching.

11 children and 3 staff are isolating due to a family member with covid, therefore 6 staff are away. We have been able to utilise relievers (including teacher aides) and re-organise existing part-time staff, so we are still operating at Level 2 Hybrid A.
