Covid-19 situation - Our updated numbers since this morning's Edge announcement is 33 current cases:

All classes have teachers and are operating normally.

Edge App and Attendance Codes: Parents who have downloaded the Edge app can view their child's attendance and the codes that teachers are required by the Ministry of Education to record by their name. There is a long list of them, however the ones that are likely to concern us are:



? Not known - no explanation (Jillian follows up)

E - Explained but unjustified (MoE provide guidance around this)

F - Off site or learning from home

G - Holiday in term time

J – Explained and justified

L - Late

M - Medical

N - School activity

P - Present

Q - School trip or camp

We are usually using P and J, occasionally E, M and there are a few L's every day. Occasionally there is a mistake where a teacher has accidentally used the wrong code. Please let us know if this happens and we will change it. Please also understand these codes are a requirement of us.

If a child arrives in the classroom after 8:55am, codes are sent to the office straight away. They will be marked with an L. We will not be changing that.

The Ministry of Education has specifically told us in writing to mark children who are staying home solely because their parents don't want them at school while Covid is in the school as **E** - **Explained but unjustified**. However we have discretion if there are particular circumstances and I have told Jillian that any children who are away due to having vulnerable whānau are to be marked **F** (**Home learning**).

It is therefore very important to let us know the reason a child is absent so that our information sent to the Ministry is accurate and complies with the codes we are *required* to record. We rarely use the E code (Explained but unjustified). We know there are circumstances that happen in every family that may not

fit into a classification neatly. For example, grandparents visiting who haven't seen their grandchildren for a long time, or a special family occasion. Usually if you have explained the situation then J will be used. However these situations should be rare - a pattern of staying away for non-health related reasons will result in E being used.

The Ministry send the school data on attendance every year. This is important information for me and the board as it provides data that contributes to our overall picture of engagement and achievement.

Year 7 Vision Testing – Information for parents


Regional Public Health provides a vision screening programme for all year 7 students.

- Vision pupils will be advised of results at the time of screening. If further assessment is recommended you will be notified by mail.
- Children who wear glasses and/or are under professional care and have regular checks will not require a vision check from our service.

Non-Consent – please notify your school if you do not want your child being screened.

This screening is not a full assessment of your child's vision. If you have any concerns, please see an optometrist.
