Attendance in Term 2 - Starting afresh! As you can see our Covid-19 numbers have reduced significantly. We hope to see as many children as possible back at school next term. The ministry is sending a strong message that children need to be back at school, engaged in learning onsite and interacting with other students. Data from around the

country shows that concern about attendance is justified. There are ministry people available to contact families if a school has ongoing concerns about individual students.

Over this term Otari School has taken an understanding approach as families dealt with the spread of Covid-19 throughout the community. However the time has come for a shift in expectation as we look towards term 2. Therefore, all students who are feeling well or not isolated at home due to being a household contact, are expected to be at school on day 1 of term 2.

Teacher Only Day, Thursday 14 April - This Thursday teachers will be focussing on planning for term two. They will be evaluating their programmes from the past term, updating records about student engagement and achievement in light of the



forthcoming reporting that happens in term two and they will be planning how they will further address their professional development goals for this year. Teacher aides will also be meeting to discuss issues of relevance in relation to their challenging roles, including providing feedback on a draft code of conduct.

Taonga Horomata/Virtues: Purposefulness - Whakataranga "The purpose of life is living a life of purpose".

"He manako te i kōura i kore ai" - Wishing for the crayfish won't bring it.

Purposefulness and knowing the purpose! Being purposeful about our learning is the usual context we discuss this virtue in. However, purposefulness can also be something we explore in relation to cultural practices, observances and participation in traditional and religious events and activities.

At hui on Monday I talked about how festivals, holy days and special holidays have different meanings for different people. Despite this, each festival and holy day also has an *original* purpose as do the practices and symbols that pertain to them. Easter, Passover, Ramadan and Anzac Day are all being observed over this month. Later this week many children will eat hot cross buns and chocolate eggs, and behind these yummy treats there is an original purpose to the making of the buns and the gifting of the eggs, just as there is for the fasting that occurs during Ramadan and the foods eaten during passover and the red poppies worn by so many before and on Anzac Day. Knowing about the purpose behind traditions and symbols is interesting and informative. It also supports the virtues of understanding, tolerance, appreciation and respect.

The forthcoming weeks may be a time of reflection, contemplation, family togetherness or solitude, religious observance or connection with meaningful traditions, they may just be a time for chocolate indulgence and some cafe brunches, or they may be a combination of all of the above! Whatever the purpose or purposes are, we hope that the holidays bring you and your whānau enjoyment and refreshment.
