## Kia ora koutou

**Being Safe when picking up and dropping off** - If you drive to school to drop children off or pick them up, **PLEASE:** 

- **Do not stop at the bus stop or yellow lines** *Drop your child off in the Otari car park, further up the road before reaching Otari School, or drive in and down the driveway and drop off at the bottom. It is unsafe to park up on the curb or in the bus stop.*
- **Do not pull into the drive and stop near the front gate.** You hold up other traffic and make it unsafe for pedestrians trying to cross, especially as you try to back out.

- **Do not speed down or up the driveway!** There are children crossing at the top and other vehicles turning at the bottom.
- **Do not park your car in the turning bay, down the drive or in the disabled car park and leave it.** The turning bay is for drop off and quick pick up. If there are no car parks available then you might have to find an alternative space on the road.
- Always watch for children crossing at the top of the drive
- Please consider turning left at the top of the drive when patrols are operating. (If you would normally turn right, consider going a longer way).



**Tūmunako - Ngā mihi Kahuti mō tō kauhau!** Thank you, Kahuti Hook, for representing Otari School at the opening of the Tūmunako art exhibition last Friday. Kahuti delivered a speech expressing the whakatauki of this year's celebration: "Kōtahi te kākano whakaaro, he nui ngā hua o te rākau houhou rongo." (One seed of thought grows the forest of peace.)

Tūmanako! (meaning Hope!) is an annual art exhibition for tamariki/children and taiohi/young people to create works of art to share their aspirations for a peaceful, inclusive and nuclear free world in remembrance of Hiroshima Day. At a time of unrest and divisiveness, Tumanako! enables tamariki and taiohi to learn about the root causes of violence and promote peace. Otari School children from each of the strands submitted art work for the exhibition. The exhibition is being held in Johnsonville Library, for two weeks from 11-22 August.
