**Thank you Montessori Parents** - Our Montessori classes have had to move all their furniture into the hall in preparation for refurbishment during term 1. Thank you to all those who helped Deborah and Paula shift their furniture on Sunday. It is a big job and would not have been possible without your help.





**Teacher Only Day: Monday 24 April** - The Ministry of Education has decided to provide two teacher only days during 2023. This time they are not allowing schools to have a lot of choice, only providing a two week time frame in which to choose the day. The first time frame is a two week period from the start of term 2. (The other one is yet to be decided.) It would therefore make sense, with term 2 starting on Monday 24 April to choose this day as a teacher only day, since Anzac day follows. Therefore the term 1 holidays will be extended by two days (24th and 25th April) with the 24th being a teacher only day focussed on curriculum development.

**Powhiri** - We will be having a powhiri to welcome all new Otari whanau at 9am on 1 February 2023. This powhiri is for any children who may be starting in 2023. All parents are welcome to attend this.

A Good Year - There is only half a day to go until we finish for the year. It has been a challenging but very satisfying and successful year. The challenges have been due to the lack of relievers, during a year of high students and staff absences due to covid. (We seem to be entering round two with a few staff and students away today.) However, despite the challenges we maintained learning programmes, provided a lot of very engaging extra-curricular experiences and did not once need to double classes. While not a long term sustainable solution, it also didn't hurt the principal to experience a few days of being the reliever!

We are finishing the year in a good place, with most of our annual goals achieved, including our learning achievement goals with pleasing academic results throughout the year that reflect learning has been maintained, despite interruptions. We have a stable staff and Board, prepared for 2023.

Thank you all for the many ways you have supported us and contributed to our community throughout the year.

Next year our curriculum priorities will include:

- A whole school genre based approach to lifting writing achievement (we will be providing information about this for parents as we teach each genre)
- Field based science experiences for all strands
- Structured Literacy professional development
- Further pāngarau professional development
- Deeper implementation of the Aotearoa, NZ Histories/Te Tangata o Te Wā.

The Board will be preparing a new 3 to 5 year Strategic Plan and this will involve a range of opportunities for consultation feedback that can help inform the eventual plan.

All in all we have much to be thankful for this year and lots to look forward to. We will see you all back here on 1 February 2023.


