**PAID UNION MEETING:** On **Tuesday 6 September** at 1:30pm the New Zealand Education Institute and the PPTA are having paid union meetings to discuss concerns regarding the Governments "Global Budget" proposal. The meetings are for all principals, teachers and support staff who are union members.

Normal classroom instruction will not be continuing during the half-day of the paid union meetings as all NZEI members have an entitlement to attend them. However, most schools also need to technically remain open and will offer a skeleton operation for children who have no other choice than to be at school. Both Pridelands and Otari After School Care will be operating from 1pm.

Teachers will be going to the meetings at 1pm. I want to know in advance that every child is either going home or having responsible adult supervision following dismissal for lunch. Please ensure you provide this information in the slip attached to this newsletter. For those children going home please ensure they are picked up between 12.30-1.00pm

You can read about the funding proposal on the Ministry of Education Website and NZEI's concerns on the NZEI Te Riu Roa website. This afternoon Susan, Api and I are attending a seminar by the Ministry of Education to hear more about the funding proposal.

**Parent Interviews: Date Changes** - Due to the paid Union Meeting we have needed to bring our parent interviews forward.
