Term 4 Board Update

This term has been another busy one for the Board. As we get ready to farewell our Year 8s it is timely to think about all the work that goes on at the school to ensure we can achieve our vision of "Inspiring a love of learning through education that values the development of the whole child". This term the Board has focused on:

Connecting with and thanking the staff: In October the Board invited staff to a social event in the staff room. It was a great opportunity to acknowledge the hard work that goes on every day in order for the school to be the school we cherish. On behalf of the Board I will formally acknowledge Clifford and the staff at the Year 8 farewell tonight but for those who aren't going to be there please know that we appreciate all the work and good humour that goes into teaching our children.

Annual Plan: We have a 3 year strategic planning cycle so this Board has inherited the strategic plan finalised last year. Every year we use the strategic plan to frame the annual planning cycle. At our meeting last week we decided our priorities for 2017 are to focus on the sustainability of the school (including improving our financial position, increasing parent engagement, future proofing the school and lifting the enrolments in the Immersion Strand) and doing further work on health and safety given the new legislative environment.

Budgeting: The Board reviewed the draft 2017 budget at our meeting last week. We are likely to have to approve a budget which is forecasting a major deficit. Why? Because just like other schools we have a shortfall in financial provisions from the Ministry but unlike other decile 10 schools the contribution rate for our donations is poor and getting worse. This year we tracked at 51% of families paying their donation. This is well below the average level of contribution of 81% achieved by the other decile 10 primary schools in the area. Given our rate per family is the lowest in the area the Board are frustrated. Next year we are going to have to address this deficit with additional fundraising. We will look to revive the parent committee as part of this drive.

Looking forward to 2017: The much needed upgrade of the Original Strand classrooms will start next year. Whilst there will be short term disruption, it will be worth it! We have the Year 7 and 8 school camp in early March. This is the highlight of our kids primary school years because our fabulous senior teachers create a wonderful environment for the kids to flourish.

That's all from the Board for 2016. Enjoy the holidays everyone, see you in 2017.
