School Wide Professional Development - This year all strands have been involved in Digital Learning professional development. This has been accessed through the Ministry of Education and facilitated by Kathe Tawhiwhirangi. Two or three times a term Kathe spends a day at our school working one on one with teachers and delivering whole staff meetings. We share progress of our own digital learning journeys, increase our knowledge and understandings and identify school wide priorities to pursue.

Teachers and children are benefitting from the PLD. We are using the e-Learning Planning Framework to help us measure our digital fluency. This framework is a "road map" that helps us to identify where we are in terms of our digital capabilities within a range of contexts. It enables us to identify the practical steps we can take to improve our practices. The framework provides processes and practices that have proven to be very effective in lifting school wide e-Learning capability.

Phases in the e-Learning Planning Framework move from "Emerging" through to "Empowering". These phases describe how digital technologies are integrated into teaching and learning within each dimension of the framework. Further information about the e-Learning Planning Framework can be found here:

A significant development in relation to integrating digital technology for teaching and learning has been the purchasing of a screen for every classroom. The screens are all fitted with Chromecast. The screens are being used effectively to enhance the delivery of our curriculum.
