**St Brigid's Kapa Haka** - On Saturday Ngaio School hosted the St Brigid's Kapa Haka Festival at Onslow College. The kapa haka performers representing Otari School provided an outstanding performance. Our thanks to Matua Wetini, our kapa haka tutor, for his expertise that has benefitted our performers, lifted their confidence and developed their skills. Thanks also to all the kaiako involved and to whānau for their wonderful support. Congratulations tamariki mā on your superb performance.

**Kapa Haka Competition** - The kapa haka group that performed on Saturday was made up of the entire Māori Immersion Strand plus one student from the Original Strand. From these children a competition kapa haka group has been formed to participate in the Wellington Regional Kapa Haka Competition being held on 26 October at the Te Rauparaha Arena in Porirua. This is the first time that Otari School has ever participated in a kapa haka competition. More details to follow. We are happy for children from other strands to attend this event with their parents.

**Kapa Haka at Otari School -** Yesterday I received our first notification of a kapa haka festival, involving local schools, that we have been involved in previously. This is taking place during the second week of term 4, therefore rather late notice. This, and the timing of the Wellington Regional Kapa Haka competition means that the school will not be taking part in the local school's festival.

We usually participate in this, as it is an opportunity for children from the Original and Montessori strands to perform for a kapa haka festival. In previous years the expertise of kaiako and tamariki from the Māori Immersion Strand has benefitted our whole school performance. This has been most appreciated, however, this year we understand that the upcoming kapa haka competition will take all their time and energy.

As well as having enough time to practice for this kind of event, we also need the tutoring expertise required for it. We need to fund and access kapa haka teaching for Original and Montessori Strand students, whilst separately maintaining the excellent tutoring the Immersion Strand has received this year. This is a challenge I hope to successfully address when planning for 2019. **Cricket** - Last week our staff meeting was focused on cricket skills. We participated in professional development delivered by Andrew Lamb who has also been delivering cricket lessons to the children over the past few weeks. Following this excellent cricket skills learning the school will be provided with teaching resources and will also purchase the necessary equipment for the cricket related games and activities to continue, as well as the game itself.

**Music** - Today the children were entertained by the Yarra Hills Secondary School Brass Band. They learnt about the musical instruments and enjoyed listening to a selection of music. Quite a few had a turn at conducting as well!

**BOT Review** - This Saturday Otari School Board of Trustees will be meeting with a review facilitator, Kathe Tawhiwhirangi, to participate in a board self-review. The board will be reflecting on their performance in a range of areas related to their governance role.
