It's nice to know I'm missed (by at least one person) and nice to be back after our enforced, flood related absence in Kapiti. Our family was not seriously affected, however it certainly was a reminder of nature's power! It is also a timely reminder of the need to be well prepared for emergencies. Please see below; there are a large number of children without kits.

**Emergency Box** - We require each child to have a 'mini survival kit'. Please bring to school in a named ice-cream box, the following:

- 1 can of food (spaghetti/baked beans etc preferably tear top)
- 1 food bar (eg muesli bar or similar dried fruit bar)
- 1 small carton of juice ('Fresh Up' type with straw attached)
- 1 bag barley sugars/boiled sweets
- Optional a very small comfort toy
