## OTARI SCHOOL SPECIAL PROGRAMME MĀORI IMMERSION ENROLMENT TERM 4 2015 and TERMS 1 and 2, 2016

Otari School Board of Trustees is limited in the number of places it is able to offer students as a consequence of operating an enrolment scheme, details of which are available at the school office.

The Board has determined that there are spaces available within the special programme (Māori Immersion) for out of zone students in term 4, 2015 & terms 1 and 2, 2016.

For students seeking enrolment within this period the deadline for receipt of applications is **Monday 5 October 2015**. Applicants will be notified of the outcome of applications by Friday 9 October 2015.

If the number of out of zone applicants exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot following the Ministry of Education defined priority order. If a ballot for out of zone places is required it will be held on Tuesday 6 October. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within four days of it being held.

**PMP** - Next we will be setting up a special PE programme for Kaikomako and selected children in Kakano and Pohutukawa called the Perceptual Motor Programme, or PMP. The programme runs as a series of activity circuits to help children practice and develop their skills in locomotion, balance, fitness, hand-eye coordination, memory and language.

We are very keen to start the programme but require your help to run it. We will need parents who can be involved. The programme consists of two 1 hour sessions each week for approximately 8 weeks (starting in week 2 of term 4 and going to the second to last week), plus  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour setting up and putting away of equipment.

Each session is set up in 5 activity stations and each station requires an adult to supervise it. It would be preferable if you were able to commit to a block of time. We will advise you about the time slots in week 1 of next term.

If you think you might be interested in helping us with this programme, please indicate on the slip below, even if your child is not in a junior class. A training session will be provided for helpers before they start working with the children. If you require any more information before making a commitment, please talk to Britta.
